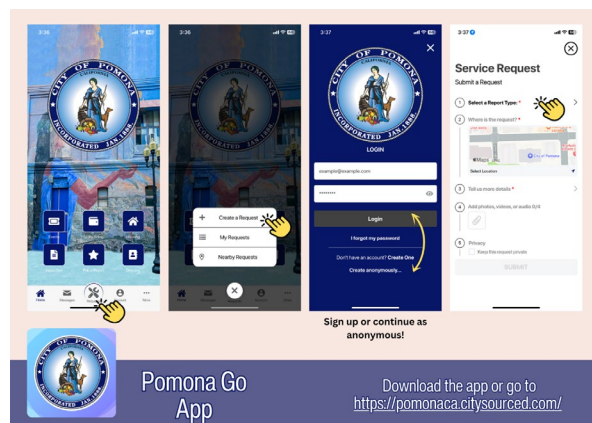

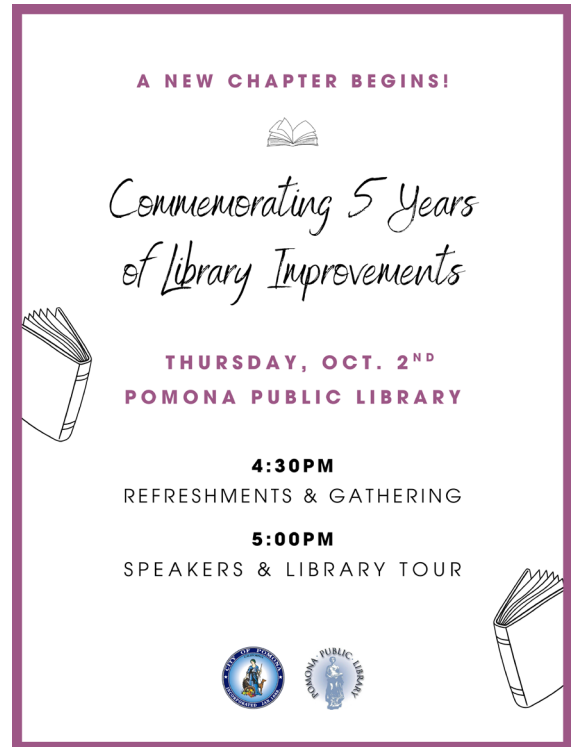

COPS 4 KIDS COMMUNITY CLEAN UP

On Saturday, September 20th, Pomona Resource Officers and Junior Cadets of the *Cops 4 Kids* program participated in their first community event of the session. Cops 4 Kids is a Police Department program that is conducted at various elementary schools within our City for students ages 9-13 years old. It consists of a 10-week program in which officers work with students to build confidence, encourage positive life choices, promote the importance of self-discipline, and leadership.



PUBLIC WORKS

STREET SWEEPING PARKING ENFORCEMENT STARTS OCTOBER 1ST

Effective October 1st, street sweeping parking enforcement will resume. Any vehicles parked in posted areas on your designated street sweeping day will be in violation and will result in a parking citation.

Please remember, our primary goal is maintaining clean streets—not to issue citations and fines.

Here's how to prevent a citation:

- Do not park in the street during the posted street sweeping days for your area.
- Do NOT return your car to the street, even if the sweeper has passed. Parking enforcement is based on the day and timeframe posted on the street signage. Although the sweeper has passed, it may not be completely done with the route or may be between trips to sweep.
- Visit the City website for details and updates on the Street Sweeping Program.
- Help spread the word to family and friends.

PARKS AND STREETLIGHT VANDALISM: SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

The City of Pomona continues to face incidents of vandalism and theft affecting our parks and public infrastructure. On Monday, September 22nd Staff discovered a serious vandalism case at Palomares Park, where an individual dug into a pull box and began stripping the wiring to the fields lighting system. These incidents are costly and sometimes leave fields dark for months at a time.



In a separate event, the Traffic Division received reports from local business owners of a homeless individual cutting traffic signal wiring, then crossing the street to open another pull box to remove additional wiring. The theft was reported to Pomona Police.

These crimes of vandalism are costly to the City. Thousands of taxpayer dollars have already been spent to repair damaged lighting at Ralph Welch Park. Lighting at Phil and Nell Soto Park remains out due to more than \$60,000 in damages and limited funding for repairs.

We urge residents and business owners to remain vigilant. If you observe suspicious or irregular behavior, please report it immediately to Pomona Police Department at (909) 622-1241. Your engagement and quick reporting play a critical role in protecting community assets and keeping our parks and public spaces safe and functional for all.
