YOUTH & GOVERNMENT HIGHLIGHTS

The Youth & Government Program (Y&G), a partnership between the City and the YMCA of Orange County, designed to empower high school students through hands-on civic engagement. The program provides a space for students to develop leadership skills, public speaking skills, and gain a deep understanding of civic responsibility. Participants engage in monthly workshops and this week, student delegates held a meeting centered around a mock California Constitutional Convention, where student delegates practiced debating and analyzing critical issues impacting their local communities, as well as statewide and national concerns.

The Teen Program hosted a successful outreach event at Garey High School's College & Career Fair. 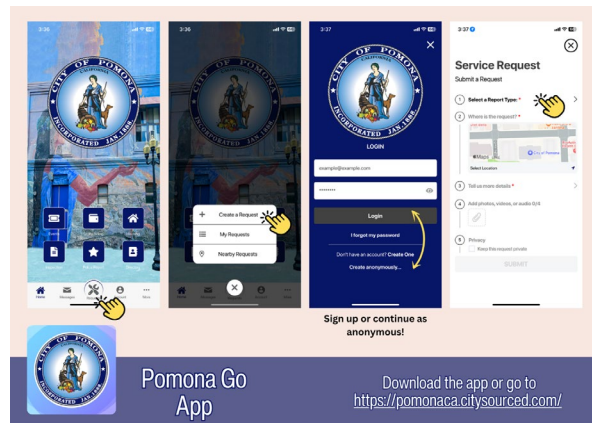

REMINDER - STREET SWEEPING PARKING ENFORCEMENT NOW IN EFFECT (STARTED OCTOBER 1ST)

What's new in Pomona? On Wednesday, October 1st, the City's contractor, LAZ Parking Enforcement began street sweeping parking enforcement, including issuing citations in posted areas of the City.

Here's how to prevent a citation:

- Do not park in the street during the posted street sweeping days for your area.
- Do **NOT** return your car to the street, even if the sweeper has passed. Parking enforcement is based on the day and time posted on the street signs, not on when the sweeper comes by. Although the sweeper has passed, it may still be completing its route or making additional passes.

LAZ vehicles will be monitoring and patrolling our City streets. Their primary goal is to ensure compliance and help maintain safe, clear traffic flow – keeping our roads clean and storm drains clear. Issuing tickets is a last resort.

MORE PARK IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY!

Washington Park is getting new restrooms! This project is funded with American Rescue Plan funds and CIP Project fund reserves. Construction for the new restrooms has begun and is anticipated to be completed by Spring 2026.

A portion of Washington Park will be closed tentatively on Friday, October 10, while we crane in the new prefabricated restroom building. Please see below for park closure area. We apologize for the inconvenience and thank you for your patience as we work to improve our parks. Once restroom renovations are complete, the improvements will be well worth the wait and will enhance the overall experience for everyone!

Washington Park - Restroom



Currently Washington Park has two restroom facilities, one serving the baseball fields and one serving soccer, basketball, softball and the Community Center. Both restrooms will remain open during the project. Once the project is constructed and open for use, the existing restrooms connected to the Community Center will be closed.
