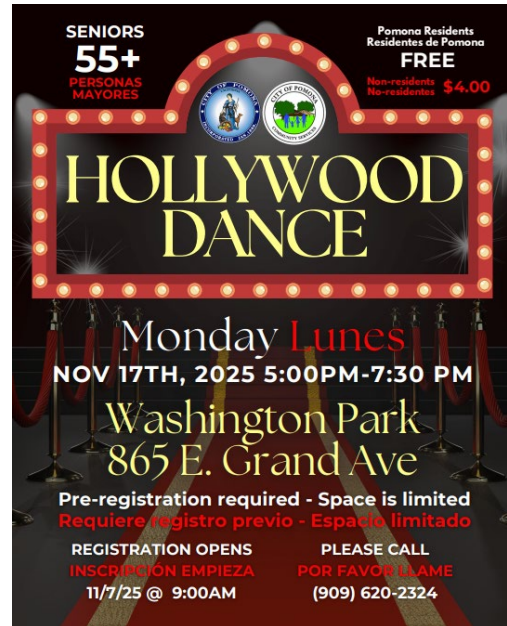
MONDAY NIGHT DANCE RECAP

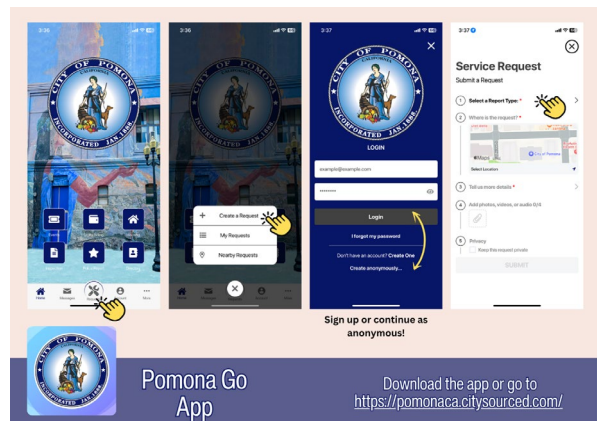

🚗 Vehicles left in the lot **may be towed** to allow for uninterrupted work

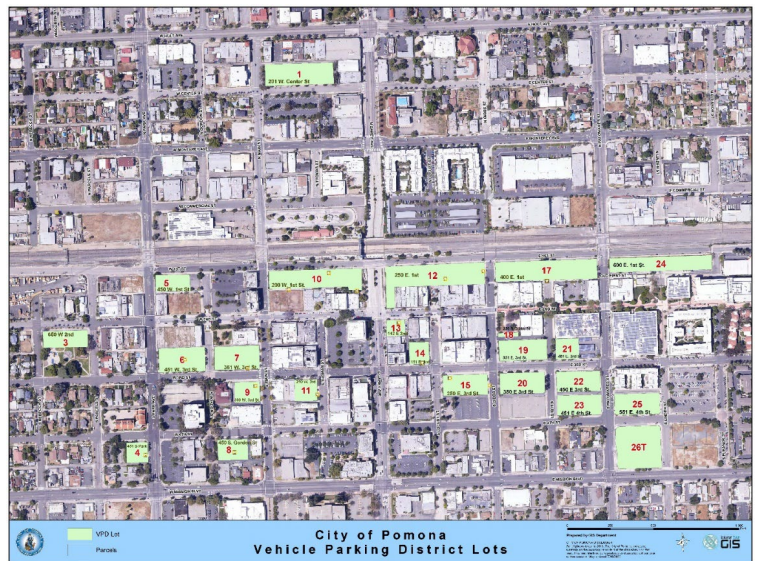
📅 A notice will be posted at least one week in advance to inform the public
