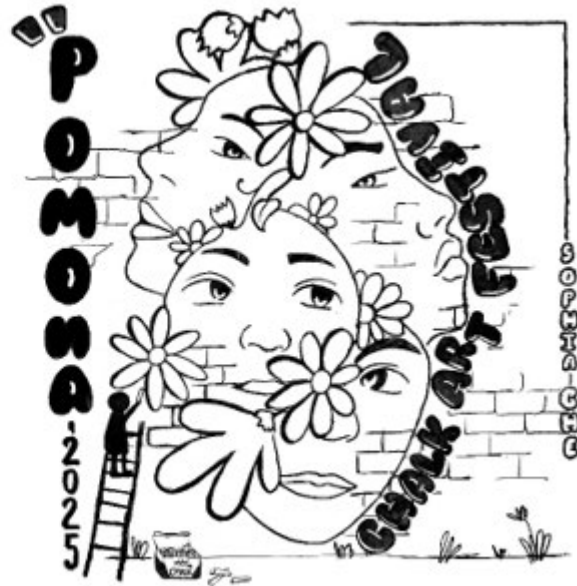

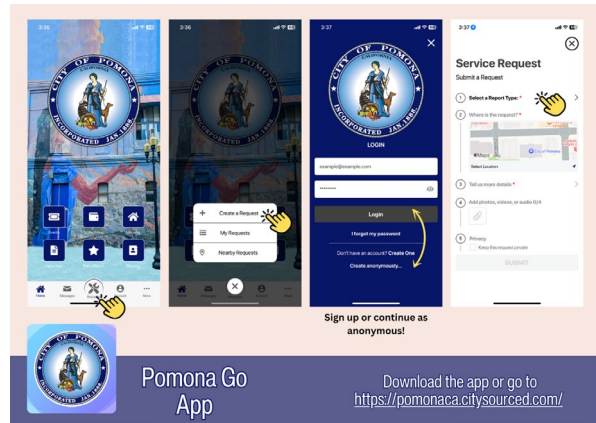

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

CITY OF POMONA FEATURED IN AN ESRI PUBLICATION

The IT Department is proud to announce that the City of Pomona was featured in the prestigious [Esri Map Book](#), Volume 40, which was distributed to attendees at the 2025 Esri User Conference, held in San Diego, CA, during the week of July 14–18, 2025. Inclusion in the Esri Map Book is a notable achievement, as it showcases outstanding GIS work from across the globe. The showcased map, titled "[Digitized Traffic Signal Assets](#)," appears in the Transportation section on page 63 of the publication. This recognition highlights the City’s innovative use of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) to enhance transportation planning and infrastructure management to support better decision making in the future.

The Public Works Department and the GIS team within the IT Department worked together to transform traditional 2D as-built drawings into 3D scenes, transforming the City’s digital traffic signal assets into a more modern and comprehensive view of traffic infrastructure.

This is just one example of how our interdepartmental collaboration has empowered us to leverage GIS technology for smarter urban management. We look forward to continuing this momentum and driving even more innovative solutions for our community.

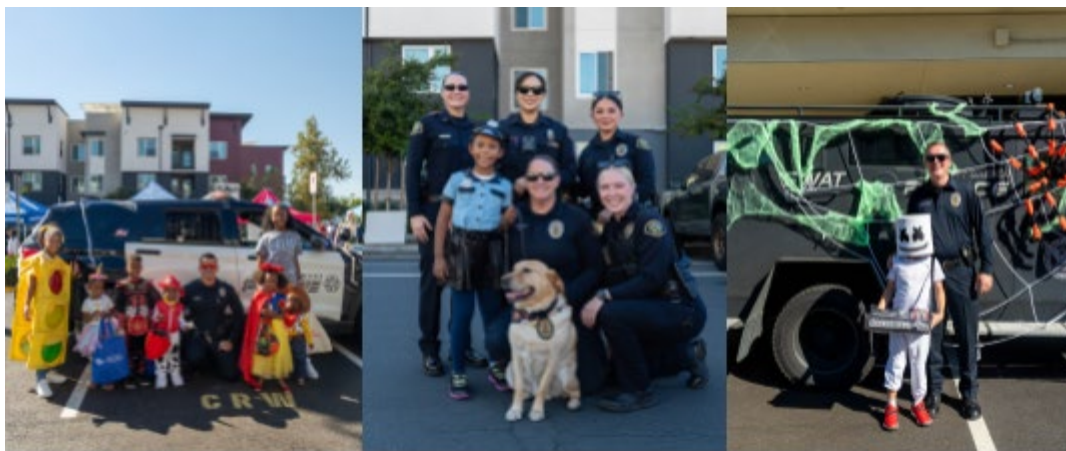

POLICE

POMONA POLICE DEPARTMENT SPOOKTACULAR

On Saturday, October 18th, the Pomona Police Department hosted its annual Spooktacular Celebration. This was a fun Halloween event where more than 200 families participated in a variety of activities, including costume contests, games, and trick-o-treating. The Pomona Police Department awarded prizes for the most creative child costume. Pomona Police personnel and community partners such as Athens, Lions Club, and Credit Union of Southern California were also in attendance. Everyone had a hauntingly good time!



PUBLIC WORKS

ADVANCED CLEAN FLEETS (ACF) REGULATION AMENDMENT

The Advanced Clean Fleets (ACF) regulation requires state and local government agencies to purchase a certain percentage of zero-emission vehicles (ZEVs) when replacing medium and heavy-duty vehicles in their fleets. It originally required agencies to purchase 50% of ZEVs, when replacing medium and heavy-duty vehicles, from 2024 through 2027, and 100% of ZEVs starting in 2027. This ACF regulation set a pathway to phasing in zero-emission medium and heavy-duty vehicles into fleets to improve air quality and public health in California.

The California Air Resources Board recently held a hearing to amend the ACF regulation requirements to assist agencies in meeting their goals. This includes extending the 50% ZEV purchase requirement by three years and delaying the 100% ZEV purchase requirement to 2030. The amendment is in effort to ease the entry to ZEVs for public fleets, allowing more time to transition to zero-emission medium and heavy-duty vehicles.

DISTRICT 1 LOVE YOUR PARK EVENT

On Saturday, October 18th District 1 Councilmember Debra Martin hosted a *Love Your Park* cleanup event at *Phil and Nell Soto Park*. Community volunteers and Parks Staff spent the morning replanting bare areas with native species plants, applying fresh mulch, and completing much needed cleanup of this unique and award-winning park.

The volunteer team also enhanced a new “Just Us for Youth” planter area, installing native plant material and refreshing the space as part of the day’s beautification efforts. The event highlighted the power of civic engagement, stewardship, and partnership between City Staff, residents, and local organizations.

A special thanks to Councilmember Martin, all the volunteers, and the Parks Staff for their dedication and teamwork in helping keep Pomona’s parks vibrant, clean, and welcoming for the community.





WATER RESOURCES

18TH ANNUAL SAN ANTONIO CANYON WATERSHED CLEANUP DAY

The Cities of Pomona and Upland, in collaboration with the San Antonio Water Company, hosted a Watershed Cleanup Event on October 11th. More than 80 participants volunteered their time to support the protection and enhancement of the local watershed. Cub Scouts and Girl Scouts also participated, contributing to a strong community presence.

The Chino Basin Conservation District provided an educational component through a watershed model demonstration, illustrating the effects of trash and non-stormwater runoff entering the storm drain system. The activity emphasized the importance of environmental stewardship and pollution prevention.

Special appreciation is extended to all volunteers and partner organizations whose efforts made the event both successful and impactful. Their collective commitment continues to promote cleaner waterways and a healthier community environment.



WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT HOSTS LOCAL CUB SCOUTS

On October 15th, the City of Pomona Water Resources staff hosted a group of 25 Cub Scouts, along with their parents and siblings, at the Pedley Spreading Grounds. The visit supported the Scouts' adventure project focused on understanding natural resources and the movement of water within their community.

During the visit, participants learned about local water sources, treatment processes, and the importance of water conservation. The tour concluded with a hands-on water cycle bookmark activity, and each scout received a "Paws and Conserve" backpack as a reminder of their learning experience.

This educational outreach provided an engaging opportunity for youth to better understand how water is managed and protected within the City of Pomona.



CALIFORNIA'S AB1572: PREPARING FOR THE NON-FUNCTIONAL TURF BAN

SoCal Gas and CalWEP have partnered together to discuss California's AB1572 which will prohibit non-functional turf with potable water at commercial, industrial, and institutional (CII) properties by January 2028 and HOA and similar entities by January 2029.

This free, 60-minute, virtual session is designed for CII customers, including HOA representatives, property managers, landscapers, and facility leaders who want to understand how California's new non-functional turf law applies and what steps you can take toward compliance.
