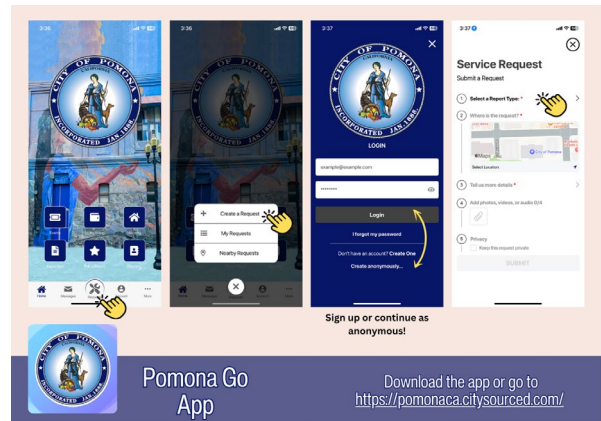

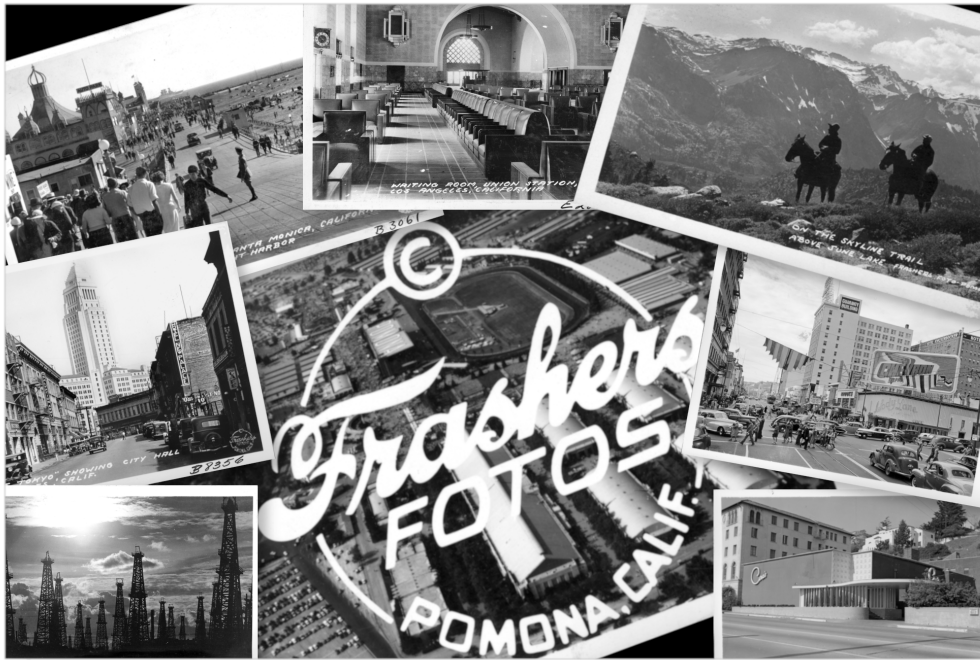

PPL AT THE ANNUAL ARCHIVES BAZAAR

Pomona Public Library’s Special Collections was one of more than 80 exhibitors at the 2025 L.A. Archives Bazaar held at Cal State L.A. on Saturday, October 18th. Special Collections staff selected to showcase our Frasher Foto Postcard Collection, at what was the Library’s inaugural attendance at this event. An estimated 600 people stopped to visit and were treated to a display of Burton Frasher’s black and white oversized prints depicting visions of L.A. Visitors also received promotional prints featuring a collage of Frasher postcards backed by information on how to access our digital collections. Staff answered questions, engaged with attendees, and had the opportunity to visit other booths to network and share ideas.
