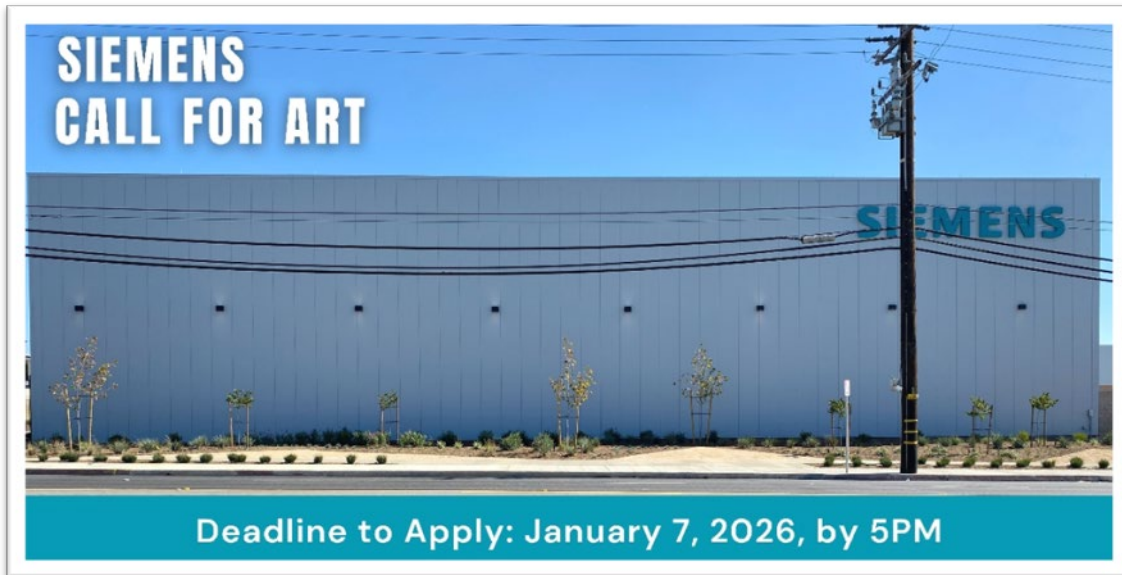
MENTAL HEALTH WORKSHOPS FOR SENIORS

ELEPHANT HILL PROJECT - NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF A DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT

The City of Pomona, as Lead Agency, has prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Report (Draft EIR) (State Clearinghouse [SCH] #2024100416) for the Elephant Hill Project. The Project proposes the development of 228 market-rate residential dwelling units, including 68 single-family units and 160 multifamily units; a private recreational center; developed and undeveloped open space, including landscaped slopes, fuel modification zones, and a slope stabilization area; utility infrastructure; and circulation and parking. The approximate 120.61 acre Project site is located, directly to the east of SR-57; south of the Union Pacific Railroad tracks right-of-way, Spadra Cemetery, and the Los Angeles County Pomona Water Reclamation Plant; north of West Mission Boulevard, Sorrento Ridge residential development, and Eaves apartments; northwest of the Pomona Police Department Range and Inland Valley Humane Society. The Draft EIR is publicly available for review and comment. The City is requesting comments on the Draft EIR from responsible and trustee agencies, interested public agencies, organizations, and the public. We invite you to submit public comments on this document for a 60-day period starting **Monday, December 8, 2025**, and concluding **Saturday, February 7, 2026, at 5 p.m.**

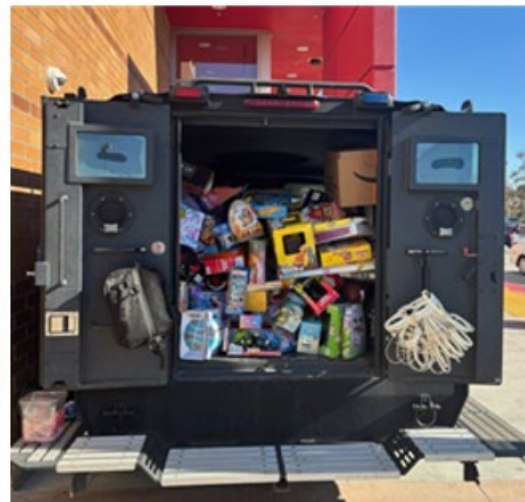

Officer D. Miller has been a member of our Sexual Exploitation & Trafficking Team (SETT) since July 2025. He recently led a large-scale investigation that resulted in multiple felony convictions, handling everything from the initial victim contact to gathering critical video evidence and ultimately supporting the case in court as the Investigating Officer. SETT's commitment to the East Holt Ave. Corridor continues to create a safer, more supportive environment for our community.
