POMONA CHILDREN AND YOUTH FUND ACCOUNTABILITY BOARD (MEASURE Y)

The City of Pomona invites youth and residents to apply for the Children and Youth Fund Accountability Board, an advisory body to the Pomona City Council responsible for overseeing Measure Y funds. The Board is composed of 15 Pomona residents, including eight youth and young adults ages 15–24 and seven adults age 25 and older.

These board members will reflect Pomona’s diverse communities and help ensure Measure Y investments support systems-impacted youth, low-income youth of color, and LGBTQIA+ youth. Members will serve two-year terms, with youth under age 24 eligible for one-year terms and meet a minimum of six times per year.

To apply for the Accountability Board, you must be a Pomona resident and not be paid employees of organizations that receive or apply for Children and Youth Fund resources. Meeting schedule and location are yet to be determined.

HEARTFUL HANDS PROJECT

Tri-City Mental Health Services (TCMHS), through its 2025-26 Community Wellbeing Grant Program, awarded grant funding to Community Services' teen-led service-learning project, Heartful Hands. The project is designed to tackle the challenges and barriers that teens face in accessing volunteer opportunities. Teens hosted their first volunteer event, *Reading Around the World* on Saturday, December 6, 2025 at Philadelphia Park, where they engaged with youth ages 7-12 exploring various cultures through books and activities. Youth and teens worked together to make Chinese lanterns and Native American-inspired dream catchers, and learned to play Lotería, a traditional Mexican game. The group played a game of soccer and enjoyed a cultural snack from the Philippines. Community Services is committed to delivering high-quality, meaningful recreational programming that promotes wellness and strengthens community capacity.



YOUTH & GOVERNMENT

Youth & Government (Y&G) participated in the Christmas Parade on Saturday, December 13, 2025. It was an honor for the Epic Pomona delegates to ride on a 1935 vintage Pomona fire truck, which they had the opportunity to decorate. Y&G is a partnership between the City and the YMCA of Orange County offering high school students a space to learn about the political process, develop leadership skills, public speaking skills, and gain a deep understanding of civic responsibility.



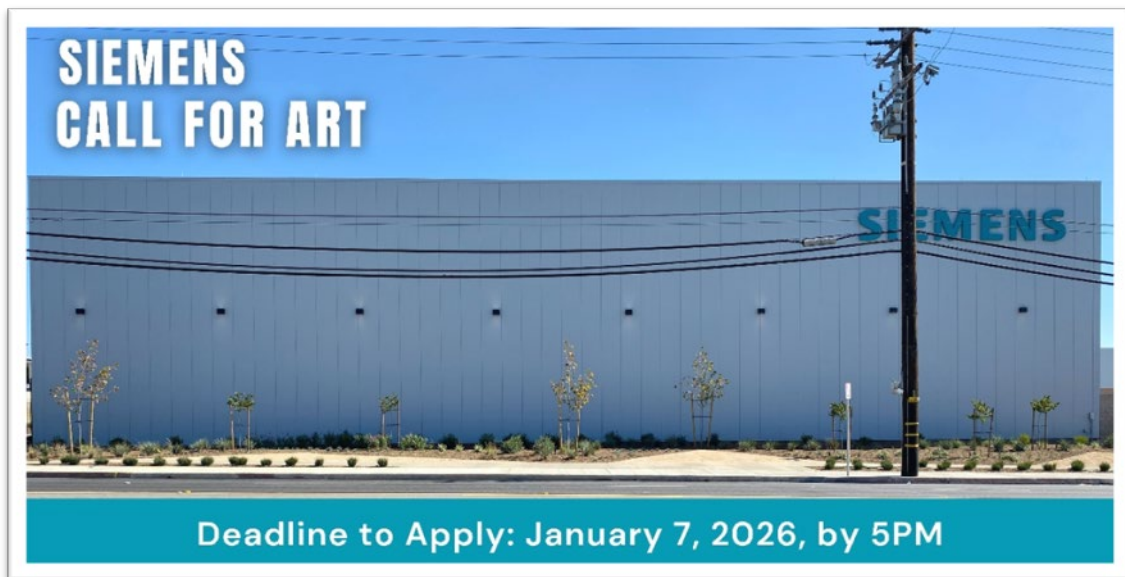
HOLIDAY AT THE PLAZA RECAP

CULTURAL ARTS **SIEMENS CALL FOR ART**



The City of Pomona's Cultural Arts Commission invites artists or artist teams to submit qualifications to render, design and install artwork in publicly accessible designated areas on a private property located at 1237 County Road. This artwork will be funded by the City of Pomona's Art in Public Places fund. City Staff has conducted engagement at community events and has collected input on ideas for the theme of the artwork. The artwork the City is looking for will require installation and the artist should be able to collaborate with a fabricator/installation company for completion of project.

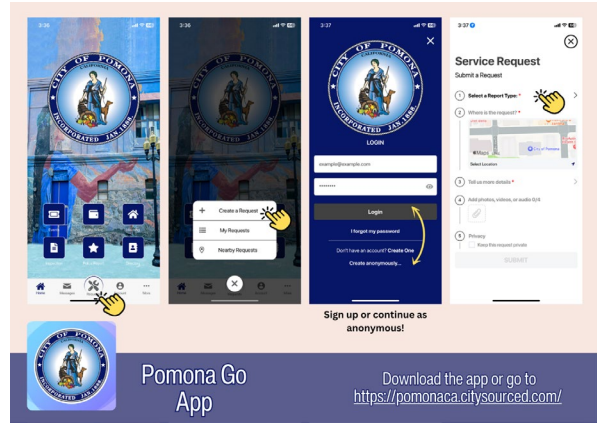
ARTWORK PRESERVATION

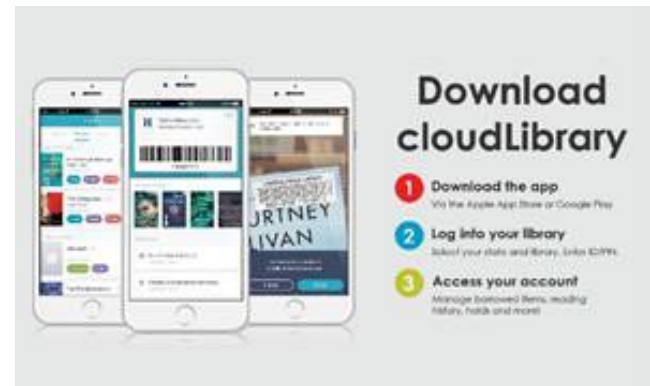

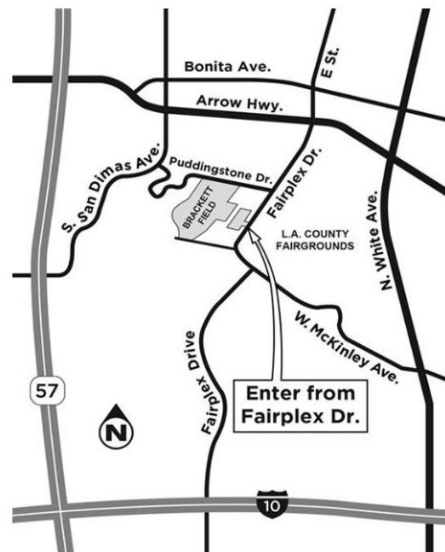

Christmas Tree Disposal: Curbside collection will begin on Friday, December 26th, and will continue through January 16th.

To participate in the curbside tree disposal, please note the following requirements:

- Remove all decorations, lights, ornaments, garland, tinsel, and stands
- If the tree is more than six feet in length, please cut in half

Artificial trees, flocked trees, and trees coated with fire retardant are NOT recyclable or compostable. These trees must be disposed of in your trash bin or through the City's bulky item pick-up program.
