RUNNING FOR LOCAL OFFICE

On June 2, 2026, Council Seats for Districts 2, 3, and 5 will be open for election.

If interested in running, file a Candidate Intention Statement [Form 501](#) with the City Clerk's office. This can be done at any time. File a Statement of Organization Recipient Committee [Form 410](#) with the Secretary of State along with the \$50 filing fee. Lastly, file your nomination papers during the filing period.

The filing period for Nomination Papers is ***Monday, February 9, 2026 to Friday, March 6, 2026***. Nomination Papers may be pulled or filed during regular business hours: 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday – Thursday at the City Clerk's office. City Hall is closed every Friday. You must make an appointment to see the City Clerk during the filing period to receive your nomination packet. 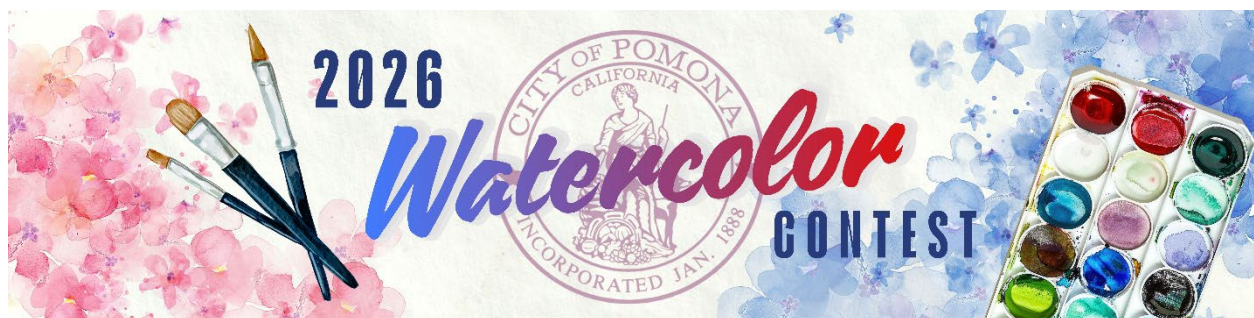

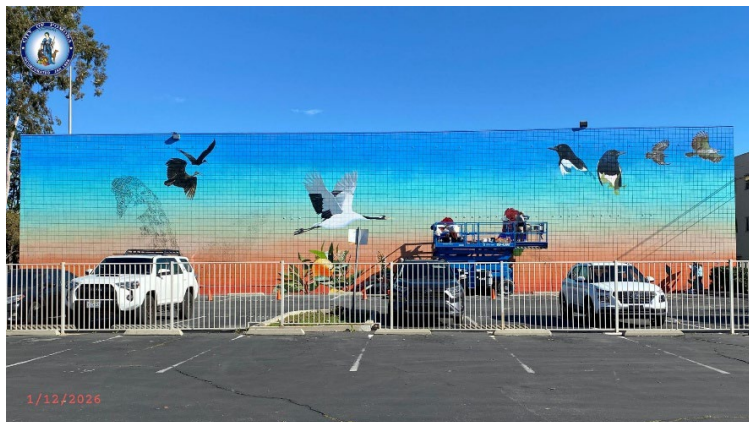

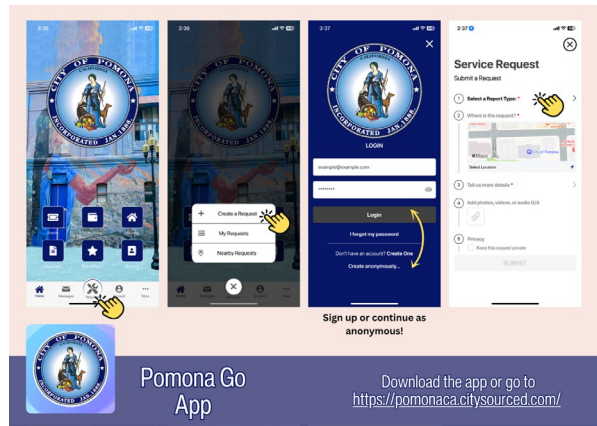
Please maintain a safe distance while the artist is at work. This is private property and is facing a parking lot actively used by the surrounding businesses.

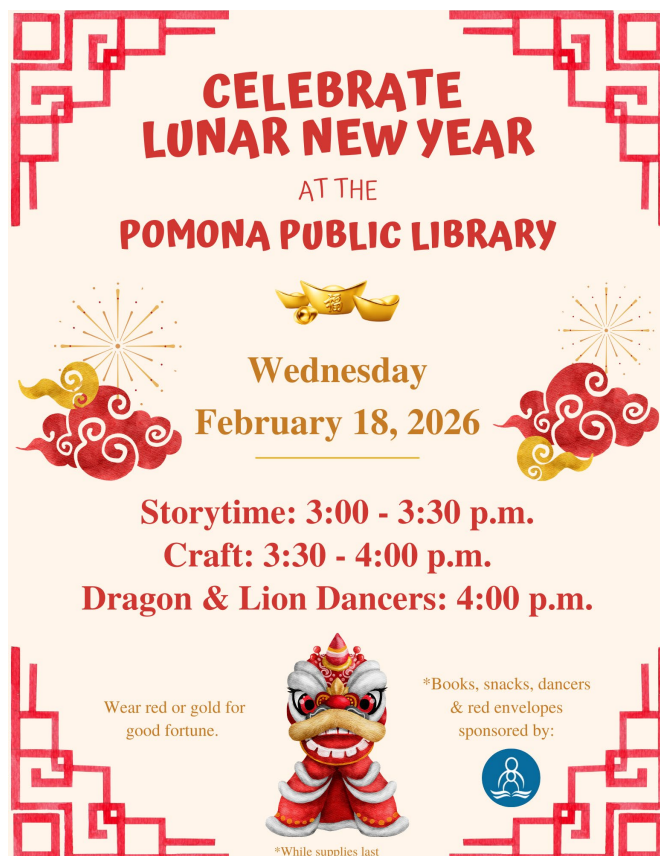

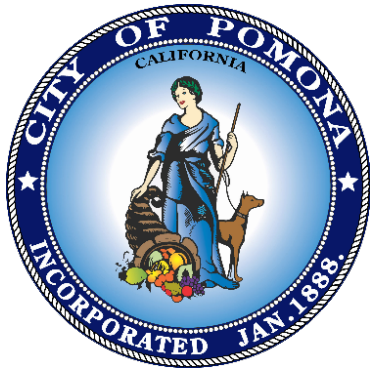

PUBLIC WORKS

GAREY AVENUE/McKINLEY AVENUE REHAB PROJECT

As part of the Garey Avenue Rehabilitation Project the Contractor will be performing traffic signal improvements at the Garey Avenue and the I-10WB on-ramp/McKinley Avenue intersection beginning the week of February 9, 2016. The construction improvements will provide a split-phase operation for east/west McKinley Avenue making the intersection turning movements safer. During these improvements, the traffic lights will not be operational, and the intersection will be treated as an all-way stop intersection with temporary stop signs posted. This work will take place between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

We understand construction can disrupt daily routines, and we appreciate your patience and understanding. Our team is working hard to complete the project as efficiently as possible. We are excited to bring lasting traffic improvements that benefit everyone in our community.



FREE COMPOST AT WASHINGTON COMMUNITY PARK!

The City's Free Compost Giveaway Pilot Program has been a huge success. Due to the strong demand, compost has been replenished at Washington Community Park. This site is in addition to the permanent compost hub at Lopez Urban Farms (1034 W. Mission Blvd).

Free compost is provided by Athens Services and is available to Pomona residents while supplies last. Bring your own container and help build a greener Pomona!

- A shovel for self-serve use



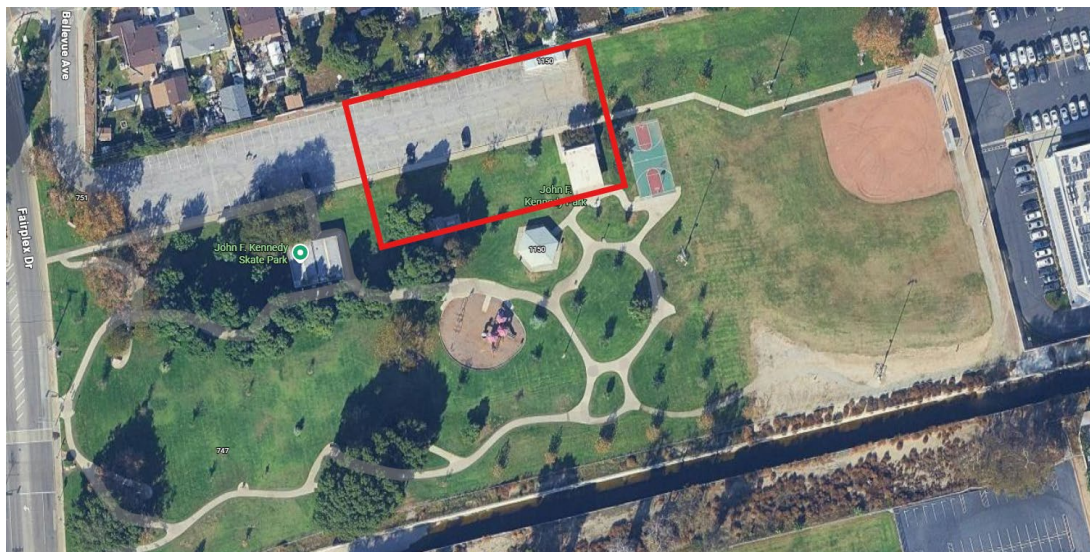
Reminder to our residents, the Washington Park site is a pilot program. Staff will continue to monitor demand over the next month. If successful, the site will be replenished regularly and may become a permanent hub.

RESTROOM AND SNACK BAR INSTALLATION AT JOHN F. KENNEDY PARK

John F. Kennedy Park is getting new restrooms and snack bar! This project is funded with American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds and CIP Project fund reserves. Construction has begun and is anticipated to be completed in Spring 2026.



A portion of the park will be tentatively closed on **Thursday, February 12th**, while the new prefabricated restroom and snack bar building are craned in. Please see below for the park closure area.



The highlighted construction area will be closed to the public. This will include portions of the parking area. The Community Center, sports courts, and children’s play areas will not be impacted during construction. **Please note, there will be no restroom facilities available at the park during the project.**

We thank you for your patience as we work to improve our parks. The improvements will be well worth the wait and will enhance the overall experience for everyone!
