On June 2, 2026, Council Seats for Districts 2, 3, and 5 will be open for election.

If interested in running, file a Candidate Intention Statement [Form 501](#) with the City Clerk's office. This can be done at any time. File a Statement of Organization Recipient Committee [Form 410](#) with the Secretary of State along with the \$50 filing fee. Lastly, file your nomination papers during the filing period.

The filing period for Nomination Papers opened **Monday, February 9, 2026 and will go through Friday, March 6, 2026**. Nomination Papers may be pulled or filed during regular business hours: 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday – Thursday at the City Clerk's office. City Hall is closed every Friday. You must make an appointment to see the City Clerk during the filing period to receive your nomination packet. 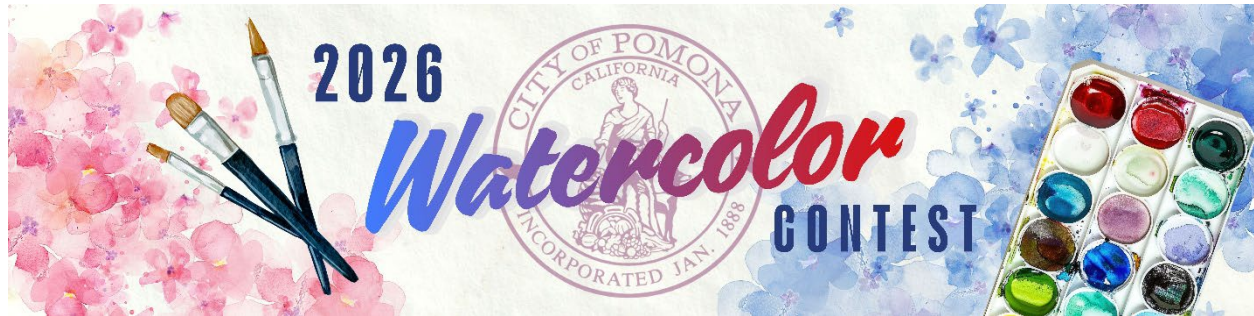


MT. SAC FREE CLASSES

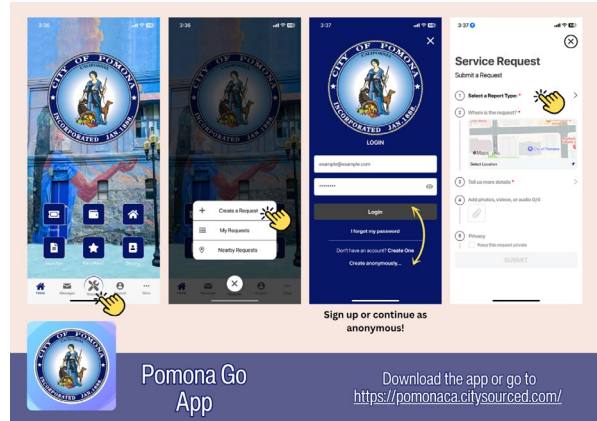


Please maintain a safe distance while the artist is at work. This is private property and is facing a parking lot actively used by the surrounding businesses.

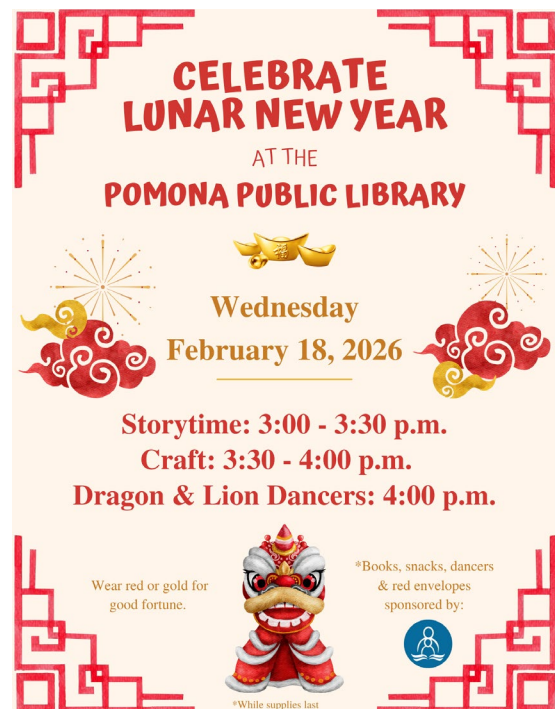


LUNAR NEW YEAR STORYTIME



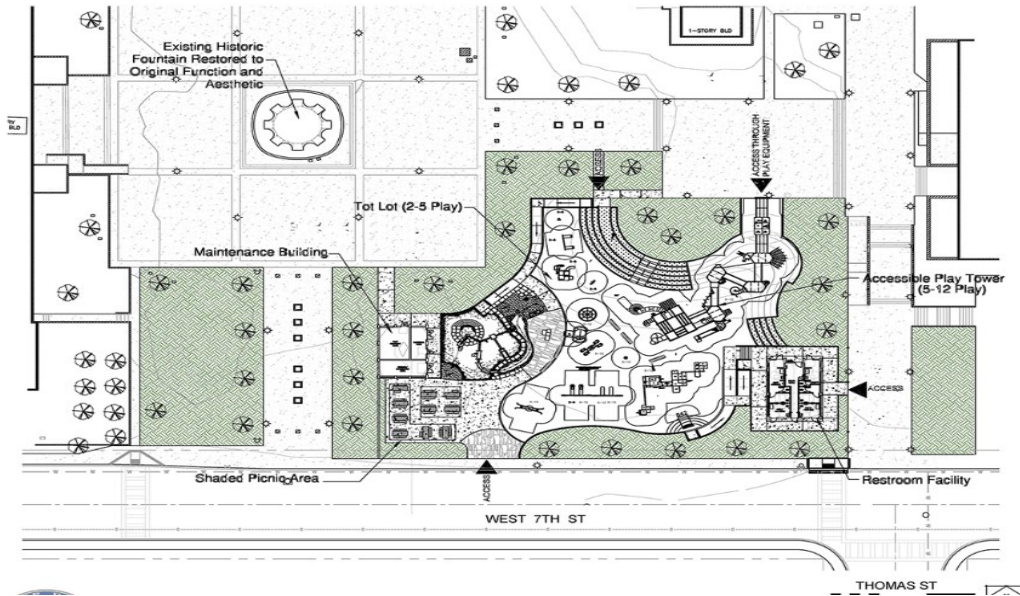
CIVIC CENTER PLAZA PROJECT UPDATE

Public Works is excited to provide an update on the Civic Center Plaza Project. The project includes restoring the public water fountain and adding features that will beautify the Civic Center Plaza. We look forward to introducing some fantastic new amenities, such as an all-abilities playground, a maintenance building, a restroom facility, and picnic area for all to enjoy. This park is perfectly located near the library, the courthouse and City Hall. By adding these new features, we hope to make the area a gathering spot for families, promote equity, and encourage more community activities. Ultimately, we want to improve health and overall quality of life while making it easier to access the library and government services. The following is the current construction in progress:

- Restoration of the historic water fountain designed by artist Millard Sheets
- Playground equipment installation
- Construction of maintenance and restroom buildings
- Water play construction
- Picnic area and shade structure construction
- Broken "P-wheel" tile replacement/installation



This project is planned for completion by mid-2026. We can't wait to see families enjoying this revitalized space and new playground when completed!



COMBATING ILLEGAL DUMPING ON POMONA BLVD.

A call to action to our residents! The **City faces ongoing challenges with illegal dumping**, which negatively affects neighborhood appearance, public health, and community pride. The 2000 block of Pomona Blvd. and SR71 is repeatedly subjected to illegal dumping and encampments. The City has responded to this issue robustly by using a collaborative action team.

Our Public Services Division teamed up with the O.A.T.H (Officers Assisting the Homeless) team and Caltrans to conduct and coordinate cleanup at this location. This joint effort included site assessment, debris/abandoned encampment removal and enforcement support to address the root causes. To help prevent future incidents, a surveillance system has been installed. We are working with Pomona Police to install a License Plate Reader (LPR) camera to assist the City with enforcement.

The presence of dumping not only detracts from the City's visual character but also diminishes the sense of safety and belonging in public spaces. Tackling it effectively requires collaboration, not just between City Staff, but with our community as well.

We encourage residents and businesses to help by reporting illegal dumping or suspicious activity when you see it and properly disposing of unwanted waste.

LIGHT POLE REPAIRS IN VPD LOTS 6, 7, AND 20

City Staff are scheduled to make repairs this week on VPD Lots 6, 7, and 20 due to vandalism/theft. The vandalism/theft has resulted in the light poles being non-operational. Full lighting is anticipated to be restored once repairs are completed. City Staff encourages the public to report any suspicious activity to help prevent further incidents via the PomonaGo App.

SCHOOL OF ARTS AND ENTERPRISE (SAE) NEIGHBORHOOD PROJECTS

The School of Arts and Enterprise (SAE) Staff and City of Pomona Staff recently met to discuss projects near the SAE campuses and possible impacts to students and faculty. The meeting highlights the City's efforts to create partnerships with our community.



Garey Avenue @ Monterey Avenue

The Transit Center Project (near the Downtown Transit Center, as well as Thomas and Commercial Street) focuses mainly on Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements such as sidewalks and curb ramps. The Project is expected to be completed by Summer 2026.

A second project at Garey Avenue (Holt Avenue and Main Street) is creating landscaped medians and repaving Garey Avenue, from Monterey Avenue to McKinley Avenue, is expected to be complete by Fall 2026. The Garey Avenue Project is currently in the process of improving the traffic signal at Monterey Avenue, as well as the crosswalks at this intersection. Holt Avenue repaving is complete. Traffic signal work is now in progress at several intersections along Holt Avenue, between Garey Avenue and Dudley Street.

Future at-grade rail crossing improvements on Main Street in the vicinity of First Street are also anticipated for 2028/2029.
