Lastly, file your nomination papers during the filing period.

## **SAVE THE DATE: TEEN EGG HUNT**

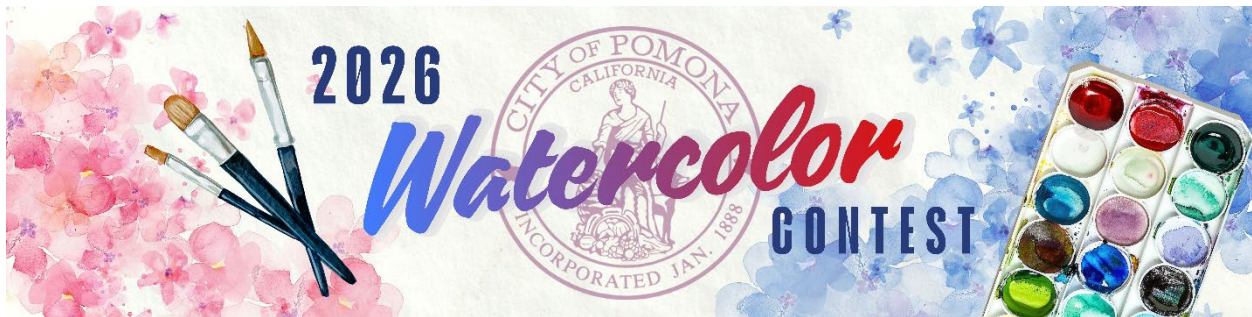

**CHEMICALS**

- Carefully secure items in your trunk/pick-up bed. Hazardous waste must be in your trunk/pick-up bed with no other items.

**PAINTS & SOLVENTS**

- Waste should be in a sturdy box, preferably in their original containers. Be prepared to leave containers.
- No explosives, ammunition, radioactive materials, controlled substances, trash, tires, or large appliances (like refrigerators, stoves and washing machines).

**SHARPS**

- Sharps disposal will require exiting your vehicle in a designated location to deposit them in a bin.

**E-WASTE**

- Open to Los Angeles County residents. No business waste accepted.
- Limit of 15 gallons or 125 pounds of hazardous waste per trip.

**QUÍMICOS**

## **MORE PARK IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY!**

We're excited to announce that Martin Luther King, Jr. Park, Washington Park, Palomares Park, John F. Kennedy Park and Tony Cerda Park are getting new restrooms! This project is funded with American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds and CIP Project fund reserves. Construction for the new restrooms began in September 2025 and will be completed in phases as listed below, with the final park anticipated to be completed by Fall 2026.

Portions of the parks will be closed throughout the course of construction, including some restroom facilities. We apologize for the inconvenience and thank you for your patience as we work to improve our parks. Once restroom renovations are complete, the improvements will enhance the overall experience for everyone!

### **1 - Martin Luther King, Jr. (MLK) Park – Restroom**



The MLK Park restroom project completed construction on January 14, 2026. It includes a newly constructed restroom at a different site within the park. The new location will work better for our park goers. As MLK park goers are aware, the former park restrooms were removed as part of the skate park expansion phase of the MLK

Improvement Project. The new restroom opened last month with a ribbon cutting ceremony and has been a huge benefit for the park goers.

### **2 - Washington Park – Restroom**



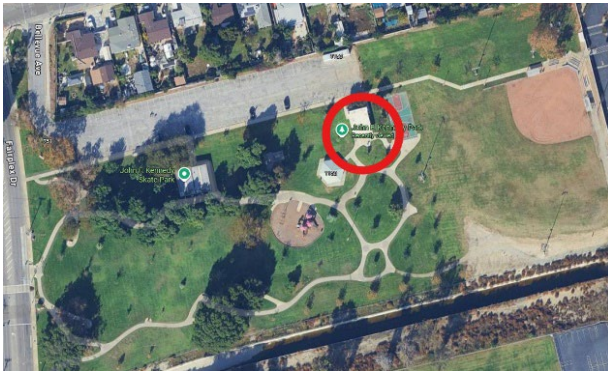
Washington Park is getting a new restroom! Currently Washington Park has two restroom facilities, one serving the baseball fields and one serving soccer, basketball, softball and the Community Center. Both restrooms will remain open during the project. Once the project is complete and open for use, the existing restrooms connected to the Community Center will be closed. The new restroom is installed, however there is utility and site work outstanding. Be on the lookout for a ribbon cutting announcement in the next few weeks.

### **3 - Palomares Park - Restroom**



The Palomares Park restroom renovation includes new restroom construction close to the soccer field and basketball court. Some spaces within the park will be closed during construction. The Community Center, sports courts, and current restroom facility will remain open for the community during construction. The new restroom is installed, however there is utility work outstanding. Be on the lookout for a ribbon cutting announcement in the coming weeks.

#### **4 - John F. Kennedy Park – Restroom and Concession**



The existing restroom and snack bar at John F. Kennedy will be demolished to install a new restroom and snack bar. The Community Center, sports courts, and children’s play areas will not be impacted during construction. There will be no restroom facilities available at the park during the project. The new building was craned into place last week. There is outstanding utility and site work to be done in the coming months.

#### **5 - Tony Cerda Park - Restroom**



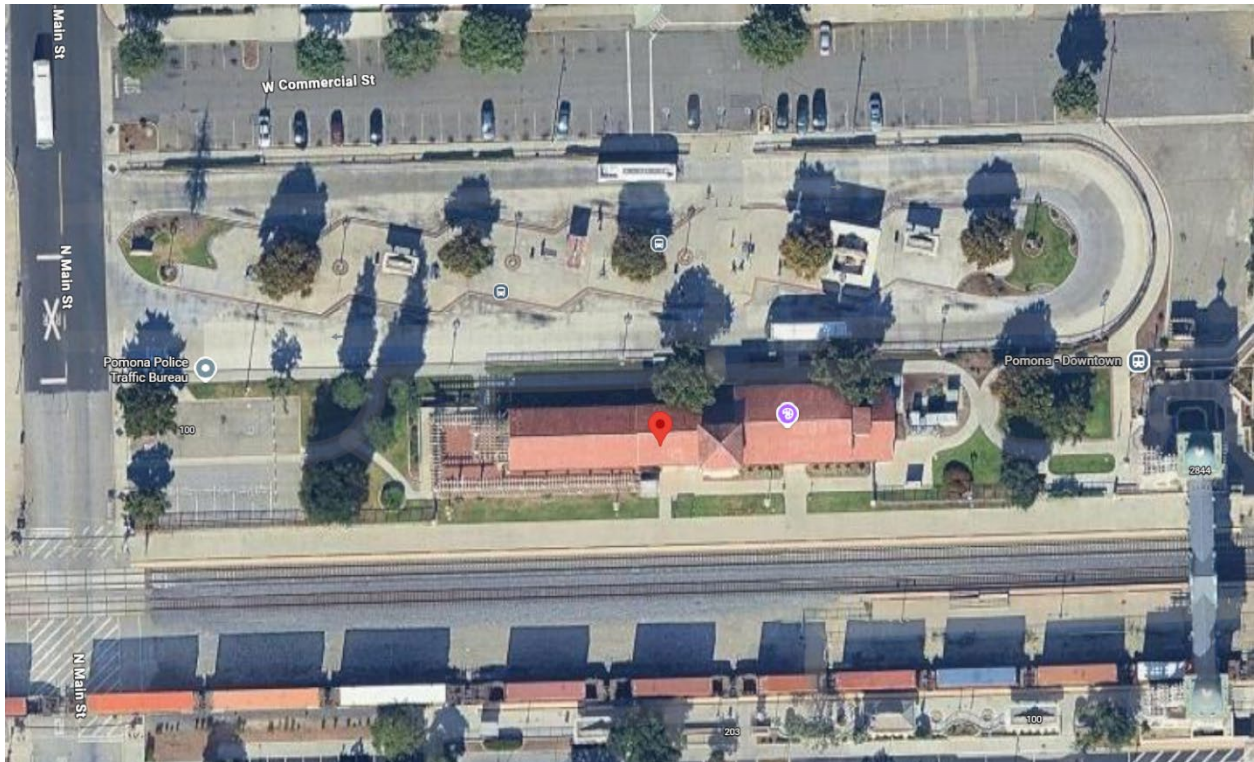
The Tony Cerda Park restroom will be demolished and replaced with a brand-new restroom as part of the Park Restoration Project. The restroom project at this park will be one of the last projects to be completed. Soccer fields and children’s play areas will not be impacted during construction. There will be no restroom facilities available at the park during the project. Construction is currently pending.

We appreciate your patience and understanding during the construction to make our parks better!

#### **POMONA TRANSIT CENTER ADA IMPROVEMENTS**

As the 2026 World Cup and 2028 Olympic Games approach, the City of Pomona is continuing to push forward to bring our public infrastructure up to the latest accessibility standards with emphasis towards areas adjacent to public transportation hubs. The downtown Pomona Transit Center and the surrounding areas have begun construction to improve Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) curb ramps, repair sidewalk, and adjacent public facilities to improve access. Project Managers are coordinating closely with Foothill Transit, Omnitrans, LA Metro, and many other local businesses and agencies to ensure access is continuously provided.

The Project completion date is scheduled for Summer 2026, barring any unforeseen project delays. We understand construction can disrupt daily routines and appreciate your patience and understanding. Our team is working hard to complete the Project as efficiently as possible.



## **POMONA SAFETY ACTION PLAN – PROPOSED PROJECTS PRESENTATION TO CITY COUNCIL MARCH 2, 2026**

The Pomona team held more than 40 outreach meetings with community members, schools, and residents to gather input on the new *Pomona Safety Action Plan*. Based on technical analysis, stakeholder engagement, surveys, and public comments, the team developed a draft list of recommendations. These recommendations will be presented to the City Council for discussion and consideration, with the goal of finalizing the proposed projects to be included in *the Pomona Safety Action Plan*. Community members are encouraged to provide feedback on the proposed *Pomona Safety Action Plan* projects at the in-person City Council meeting on March 2, 2026.



Your active participation in the process allows the City to finalize a comprehensive safety action plan that combines real data and real experiences that our community has been sharing, providing the City a strong opportunity to seek Federal and State safety grants to fund these proposed projects.
