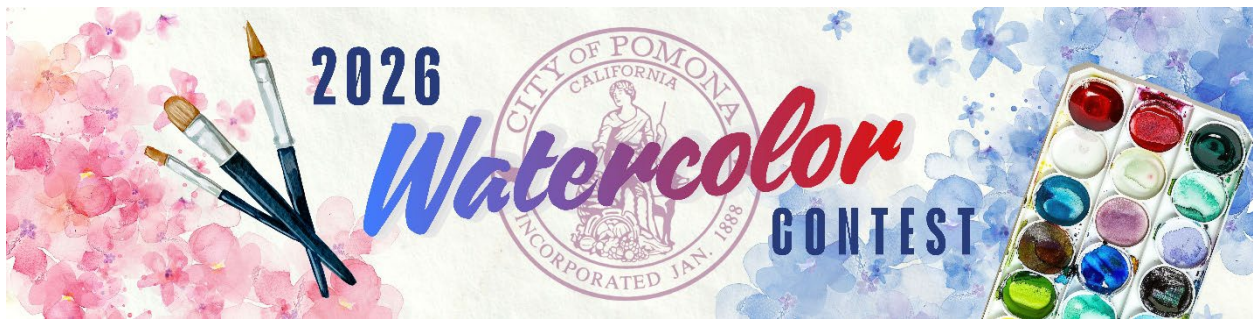
## ***COMMUNITY SERVICES***

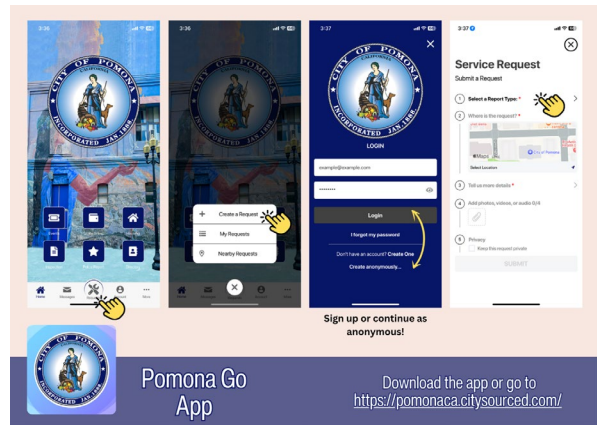

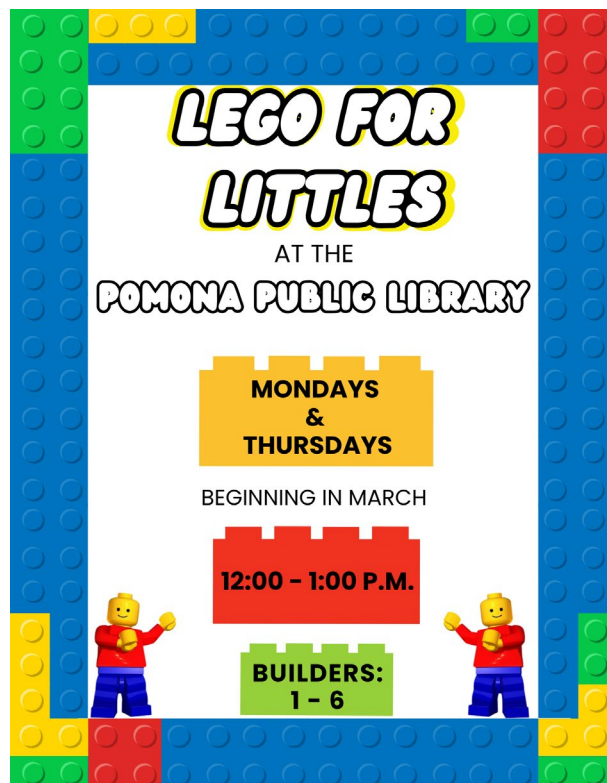

## **POLICE**

### **DUI/DRIVER'S LICENSE CHECKPOINT: FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 27**

The Pomona Police Department will be conducting a DUI/Driver's License checkpoint on Friday, February 27<sup>th</sup> from 9 p.m. – 3 a.m. within city limits of Pomona.

DUI checkpoints and patrols are done in locations with a history of DUI-related collisions and arrests. During the checkpoint, officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment, with officers checking drivers for proper licensing.

Checkpoints are funded by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

### POMONA SAFETY ACTION PLAN – PROPOSED PROJECTS PRESENTATION TO CITY COUNCIL MARCH 2, 2026

The Pomona team held more than 40 outreach meetings with community members, schools, and residents to gather input on the new *Pomona Safety Action Plan*. Based on technical analysis, stakeholder engagement, surveys, and public comments, the team developed a draft list of recommendations. These recommendations will be presented to the City Council for discussion and consideration, with the goal of finalizing the proposed projects to be included in the *Pomona Safety Action Plan*. Community members are encouraged to provide feedback on the proposed projects at the in-person City Council meeting on March 2, 2026.



Your active participation in the process allows the City to finalize a comprehensive safety action plan that combines real data and real experiences that our community has been sharing, providing the City a strong opportunity to see Federal and State safety grants to fund these proposed projects.

## ***WATER RESOURCES***

### **LACSD SEALS MANHOLE COVERS THROUGHOUT POMONA**

In 2024, the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts' (LACSD) largest wastewater treatment plant experienced excessive stormwater entering the sewer system, resulting in multiple sewer overflows. On February 5, 2024, the facility treated approximately 560 million gallons of flow, more than half of which was attributed to stormwater inflow and infiltration (I/I).

To reduce storm-related overflows, LACSD is implementing measures to minimize stormwater I/I. As part of this effort, crews will seal over 100 manhole covers throughout the City of Pomona using silicone caulk and cork stoppers. This work will occur within both the Sanitation Districts' system and tributary sewer systems to prevent stormwater from entering through pick holes and around the edges of manhole covers.



## **NEW SEWER EASEMENT MACHINE – WASTEWATER DIVISION**

The Water Resources Department's Wastewater Division has received its first sewer easement machine. This specialized equipment allows staff to access remote sewer easements that traditional combination unit trucks cannot reach due to difficult terrain or limited access.

The addition of this equipment improves the Division's ability to perform preventative maintenance, reduce the risk of sewer spills, and respond more efficiently to potential issues. This investment enhances system reliability and supports continued delivery of high-quality wastewater services.
