Lastly, file your nomination papers during the filing period.

The filing period for Nomination Papers opened **Monday, February 9, 2026 and will go through Friday, March 6, 2026**. Nomination Papers may be pulled or

filed during regular business hours: 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday – Thursday at the City Clerk’s office. City Hall is closed every Friday. You must make an appointment to see the City Clerk during the filing period to receive your nomination packet. YOUTH EMPLOYEES EGG-CITED FOR TEEN GLOW EGG HUNT

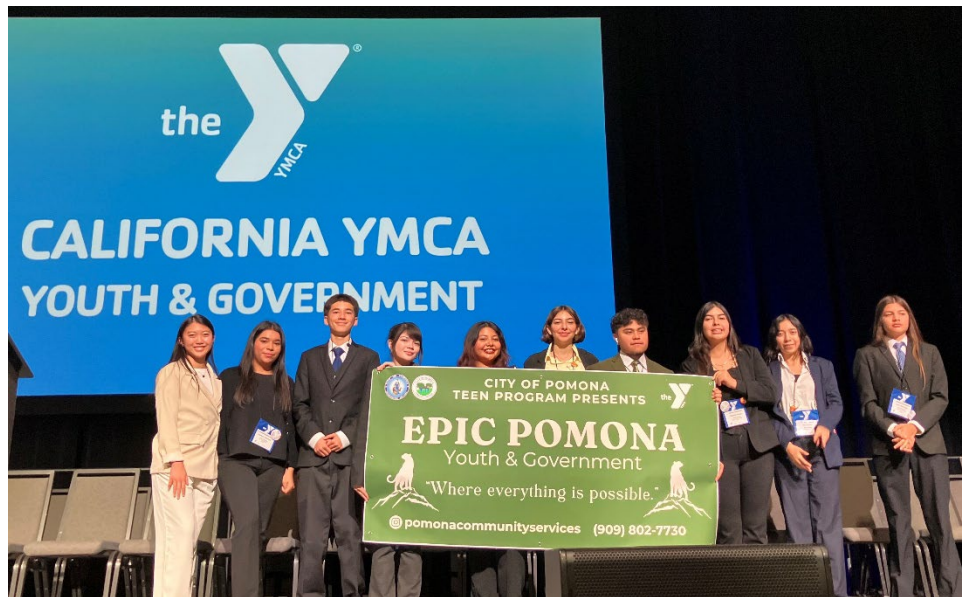

YOUTH & GOVERNMENT

Through the City's partnership with the YMCA of Orange County, 10 high school delegates attended the Youth & Government Conference in Sacramento from February 13–16, 2026. The conference brought together more than 2,000 students from over 60 delegations across California to participate in a student-run model government, where delegates served as legislators, debated bills, and followed real legislative procedures. Throughout the weekend, students spent hours in committee hearings and floor sessions, speaking in support of their proposals, answering questions, and responding to opposing arguments. The EPIC Pomona delegates presented and advocated for SB 2122, an amendment to Section 69996.3 of the Education Code related to CalKIDS funds. The bill proposed lowering the age from 18 to 16 years old, at which beneficiaries can access the California Kids Investment and Development Savings Program funds, allowing students earlier access to educational savings. The bill successfully passed the committee, passed both houses, was vetoed by the Youth Governor, and was ultimately overridden by the



legislature, resulting in final passage. This means the bill will be included in the final bill docket that will be presented to California Governor Gavin Newsom.



TEEN GIRLS EMPOWERED BY USC WOMEN'S BEACH VOLLEYBALL

On Saturday, February 28, 2026, the Teen Program took an all-female field trip to University of Southern California to support the Women's Beach Volleyball team at the Battle of Los Angeles Tournament. USC competed against Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and Concordia University, Irvine. Teens also participated in a Q&A with coaches and players and toured the campus, making it an inspiring and memorable experience.



TEEN-LED HEARTFUL HANDS SERVICE-LEARNING PROJECT

Tri-City Mental Health Services (TCMHS), through its 2025-26 Community Wellbeing Grant Program, awarded grant funding to Community Services' teen-led service-learning project, Heartful Hands. The project was designed to tackle the challenges and barriers that teens face in accessing volunteer opportunities. On Saturday, February 28, 2026, the project hosted a Family Field Day, bringing together families with children ages 7-17 for an afternoon of fun, games, and friendly competition. Participants enjoyed playing basketball, family relay races, soccer, sit-down volleyball, lawn games, and a 360-camera experience, including prizes, pizza, and snacks. Sixty-seven teen volunteers helped set up, lead activities, cheered on families, and cleaned up. Community Services continues to be committed to delivering high-quality, meaningful recreational programming that promotes wellness and strengthens community capacity.

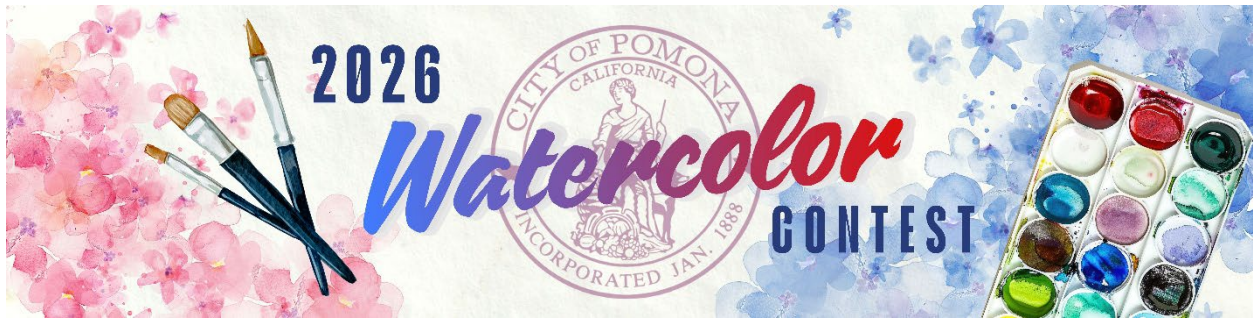


ST. PATRICK'S DAY MONDAY NIGHT SENIORS DANCE

STORIES FROM THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

As Staff and the Historic Preservation Commission research properties that may be historic, we come across stories, some interesting, some funny, some unique. We are going to share some of them with you.

The building at 3272 N. Garey Avenue, located in the Foothill Square shopping center at the southeast corner of Foothill Blvd/Garey Ave. was constructed in 1970 as a "Love's Woodpit & Barbeque" restaurant. During our research we found that it was originally designed by renowned engineer Eugene D. Birnbaum (1915-1999). Birnbaum was involved in designing over 20,000 homes, restaurants, and industrial buildings in Southern California, including most IHOP, Chuck E. Cheese, and Sizzler restaurants on the West Coast. He performed the structural engineering work for world renown modernist architect Richard Neutra. He was also the first engineer in the United States to computer model post-elastic behavior in building's responding to earthquakes. He was involved in making stress calculations for the "Spruce Goose" Hughes aircraft during World War II. Birnbaum also designed and wrote building codes for storage racks used widely in warehouses. Unfortunately, the building has been severely altered over the years and is not historic.

When we were researching 1347 South Towne Avenue, we found an article in the Pomona Progress Bulletin from March 9, 1961. The article described how Mary Matsuoka, 32, was pinned against a deep freezer in her garage when her 3 1/2 year-old son drove into her.

Car Pins Woman To Deep Freezer

A Pomona woman was knocked through her garage door and pinned to a deep freezer inside the garage Wednesday noon when her 3 1/2-year-old son apparently stepped on the car's gas pedal.

Mrs. Mary Matsuoka, 32, of 1347 S. Towne Ave., was freed by a neighbor, John Logan, of 263 Palm Pl., who pushed the car away from the freezer.

Mrs. Matsuoka was treated at Pomona Valley Community Hospital for a shoulder injury.

She told police that she had backed the car into the driveway and gotten out and walked behind it when it suddenly lurched backwards, pushing her through the garage door.

Police said the vehicle left tire burns on the driveway indicating sudden acceleration.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT (ADA) PATH OF TRAVEL FISCAL YEAR 24-25 & 25-26 IMPROVEMENTS

Getting around Pomona will soon be easier due to a path of travel construction project awarded at the February 23, 2026, City Council meeting. The approved ADA improvements will enhance mobility, safety, and equitable access to public spaces by providing better accommodations for individuals who use wheelchairs or walkers, are visually impaired, or have other mobility challenges.

The project accelerates the Fiscal Year (FY) 25-26 work and combines it with the regularly scheduled FY 24-25 work for cost of scale efficiencies. By Fall 2026, the project is planned to complete approximately \$1,000,000 of sidewalk, curb ramps, and related improvements that will make travelling through several areas of the City a much more enjoyable experience. Priority locations are determined per the City's ADA

Transition Plan. Since the list of approved streets receiving ADA improvements is quite long, we've highlighted key project areas instead of listing every street.
