USA PICKLEBALL AWARDS EQUIPMENT FOR RECREATION PROGRAMS

Through its *Grow the Game* grant program, USA Pickleball awarded a bundle of pickleball equipment to the Community Services Department to help expand access to one of the fastest growing sports in the country. The equipment bundle includes wooden paddles, nets, balls, and court markers, allowing recreation staff to introduce the sport of pickleball to new participants and expand existing recreational opportunities. This award will help remove barriers to participation, promote wellness, increase social

connection, and promote positive activities in our parks. Community Services continues to be dedicated to expanding active recreation and create welcoming spaces for all to learn, play, and stay active.

PADDLES FOR PALOMARES FUNDRAISES FOR PICKLEBALL LIGHTS

Join us this weekend, March 14 and 15, 2026, for a fundraising pickleball tournament to raise \$10,000 to fix lighting that is inoperable due to theft and vandalism. This open tournament welcomes players of all skill levels and experience. Events include Men's Doubles, Women's Doubles, and Mixed Doubles, including a Youth Division for ages 8-10, 11-13, and 14-17 years old. POMONA VALLEY HOSPITAL FREE WORKSHOPS ON JOINT PAIN

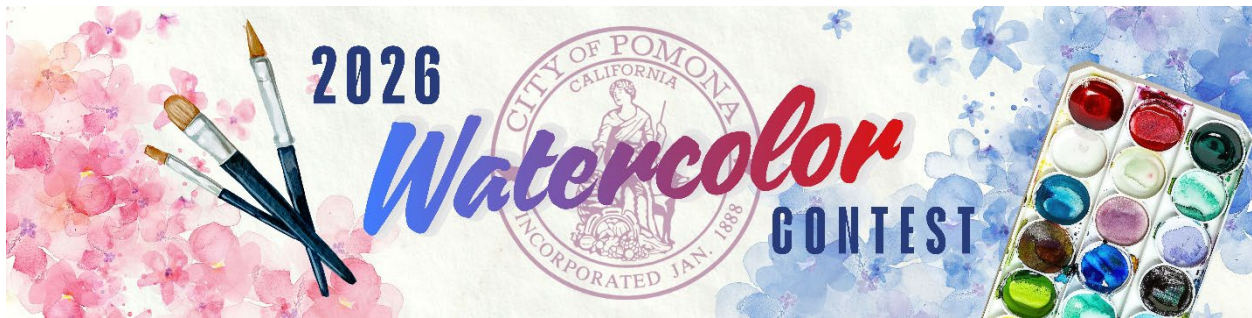

EMAIL SCAM ALERT



The FBI has alerted the City of Pomona of nationwide scams impersonating government officials requesting permit fee payments via email. The email is very detailed with project address, application/permit numbers, project description, etc.

Please look out for emails requesting payments with an invoice attached, and be especially cautious when emails are not coming from an “@pomonaca.gov” email address.

What Should You Do?

Do NOT make payments based on unsolicited email requests. Please call your City staff project manager directly to verify any payment requests before proceeding.

El FBI ha alertado a la Ciudad de Pomona sobre estafas ocurriendo a través de todo el país, donde personas se hacen pasar por empleados del gobierno y solicitan pagos de permisos por medio de correo electrónico. El correo electrónico incluye domicilios, números de solicitud/permiso, descripción del proyecto, etc.

Por favor tenga cuidado con correos electrónicos que soliciten pagos e incluyan una facturas, y sea precavido cuando los correos no vengan de una dirección que termine en “@pomonaca.gov”.

¿Qué debe hacer?

NO realice pagos basándose en solicitudes de correo electrónico no solicitadas. Por favor llame directamente al gerente de proyecto en la Ciudad para verificar cualquier solicitud de pago antes de proceder.

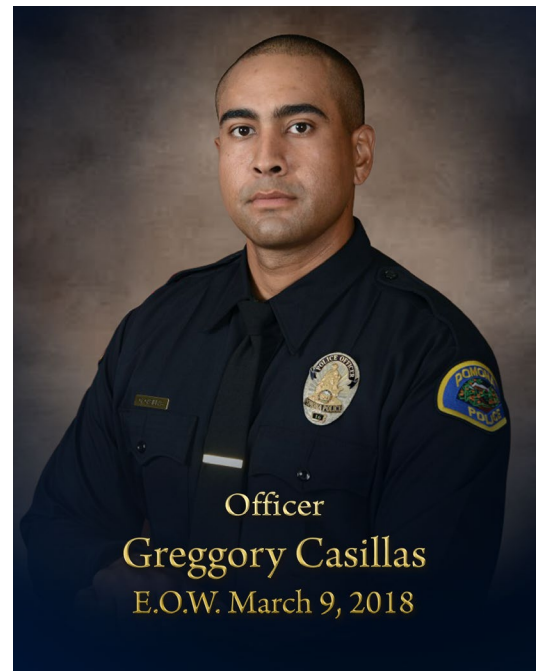
SHERMAN BLOCK SUPERVISORY LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE GRADUATE
