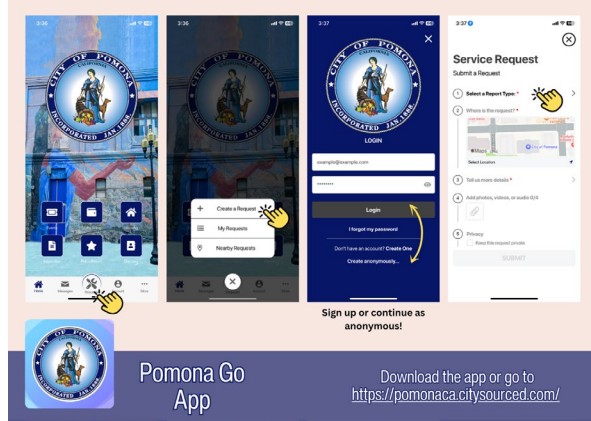

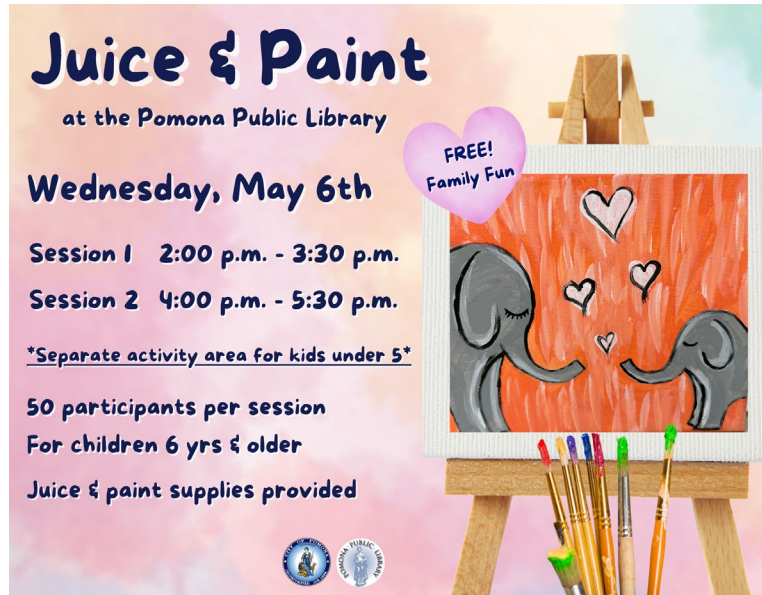

On Monday, April 20, 2026 Officer Olivas-Cano was awarded a Life Saving Medal for his heroic actions during a medical emergency.

The recognition stems from an incident on September 26, 2025 when he responded to a possible overdose near W. Holt Ave. and N. Currier St. Upon arrival, Officer Olivas-Cano immediately began CPR and helped save the individual's life. His quick thinking and actions made a critical difference.

DUI CHECKPOINT SCHEDULED FOR FRIDAY, MAY 1

The Pomona Police Department will be conducting a DUI/Driver's License checkpoint on Friday, May 1 from 9:00 p.m. – 3:00 a.m. within city limits of Pomona.

DUI checkpoints and patrols are done in locations with a history of DUI-related collisions and arrests. During the checkpoint, officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment, with officers checking drivers for proper licensing.

Checkpoints are funded by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

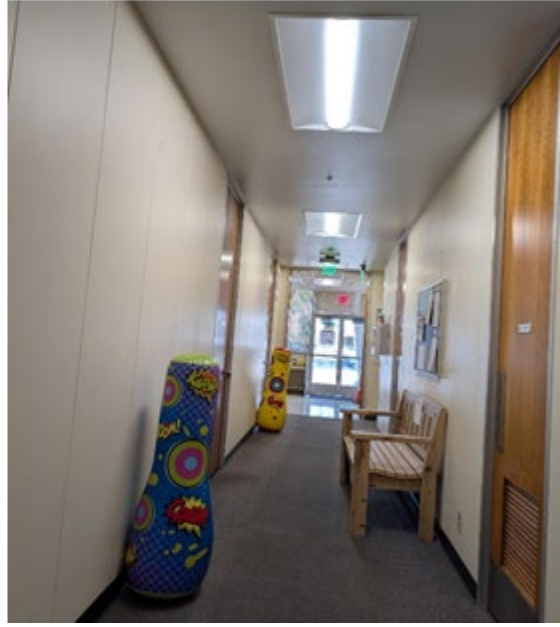
LIBRARY BASEMENT CONSTRUCTION COMPLETE

The final phase of Library improvements is now complete! Over the last several months, the Public Works team has supervised improvements to several areas in the Library basement. This work is in addition to the 2025 improvements that included a new roof, new main floor, new LED lighting on the library main floor, new children's area wall removal, and a new HVAC System.

The final phase of the \$7M major construction Library Project, included the following additional basement improvements:



- 'Hard-lid' ceilings with new LED lighting in the library halls
- Remodeled existing offices and the addition of new office spaces
- New LED lights and acoustical ceiling in various areas of the library
